Kindergarten registration

Parents of children who will be starting kindergarten in Utica Community Schools in fall 2019 can begin the registration process at a kindergarten open house being held Wednesday, March 13th, at 7 p.m.

At the open house, parents will have the opportunity to learn about the district's nationally-recognized kindergarten program, meet the teachers and building staff and submit school registration forms.

Children are eligible for kindergarten if they turn five years old on or before September 1, 2019. However, children who turn five between September 1 and December 1, 2019 are eligible to enroll in kindergarten if their parents submit a waiver form.

To register, parents must supply:

- An original birth certificate or certified copy, with raised seal, issued by the clerk of the county where your child was born or the health department of the state of birth;
- Your child's health immunization record; including vision and hearing screenings. Be sure to schedule immunization updates early these appointments are often limited;
- Photo I.D. (Driver's license or work photo I.D.)
- Proof of residency, such as property tax bill, closing papers or lease agreement. Please know that we are not able to accept utility bills.

Student placement

Our goal at Switzer Elementary is to have all classes balanced in a way that allows for every student's needs to be met. We believe classes should be balanced to ensure heterogeneous groupings.

The Switzer Elementary teaching staff will meet in May to determine placement of each student. Teachers from the students' current grade level, learning center teachers and the principal will carefully discuss the needs and learning style of each student. The major factors we consider are as follows:

- Student ability levels and demonstrated daily achievement
- Number of students in each class
- Special learning concerns or needs
- Student behavior
- Personality/Cohesiveness of entire classroom group

As educators, it is important we make informed decisions when preparing class lists, as our decisions impact all members of a classroom. Therefore, we cannot accept requests for teachers. I do however; take into consideration letters that explain certain needs, learning styles and environments that you believe your child is successful in. We do our very best to place Switzer students where they can receive the best possible instruction from our highly qualified staff.

All of our teaching staff members are state certified quality teachers who are able to provide appropriate learning experiences for your child. We are anxious to begin planning for an outstanding school year and thank you for your trust and support as we do so.



Dear Parents,

We are sure you will agree that reading is important every month. Since March is National Reading Month, we wanted to add some extra fun to this event. Switzer Elementary will be giving special emphasis to activities that promote reading as a fun and enjoyable experience. Our theme this month is "Leap into a Good Book."

To start our program, every grade level will have a minimum reading goal, which will be measured in minutes read every day at home, not including homework time. Students are to log their minutes on their reading log (included in this packet) and have parents sign the log and turn it in on Mondays. If students achieve their weekly goal and turn in their signed log, they will be given a sticker to add to their frog on their classroom door. In addition, each week they meet their reading goal, they will be entered in a weekly drawing for a Dairy Queen free cone coupon or Little Caesar's free pizza coupon. Students reaching their goal all three weeks, will be entered into a drawing for an Urban Air gift card. One \$30 gift card will be awarded per class. Classes that reach their monthly goal will earn time with a bounce house later in the year. If we reach our school goal, we will have a special assembly and activity on Friday, April 15.

SWITZER SCHOOL GOAL: 150,000 Minutes

- Kindergarten: Read at least 10 minutes per day (total of 50 minutes per week)
- First Grade: Read at least 15 minutes per day (total of 75 minutes per week)
- Second Grade: Read at least 20 minutes per day (total of 100 minutes per week)
- Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Grades: Read at least 30 minutes per day (150 min/week)

Starting on Monday March 11th Mr. Palmer will update the students' reading status on Switzervision. There is a calendar attached with recommended activities for students and parents to participate both at home and school. We hope that you enjoy all the fun and more importantly enjoy reading.
